Peer Learning Communities (Topic Specific)

Peer Learning Communities (PLC) are topic specific learning sessions that will take place quarterly in each county. The topics discussed will be determined by the participants and will be focused to support centers on their path towards improving quality. The sessions will provide an opportunity to come together with peers to share expertise, troubleshoot challenges and collaborate on best practices to improve the quality of care and education.

What to expect when you participate in a PLC:

- Shared vision and leadership
- Mutual trust and respect
- Connection with peers in the spirit of learning
- Knowledge sharing and collaboration
- Collective inquiry and creativity
- Engaging dialogue to explore new possibilities
- Brainstorming to solve challenging problems

Networking Meetings (Discussion around GNJK topics)

Networking Meetings provide a venue to meet with staff from centers that are enrolled in GNJK. A typical agenda may include program updates, breakout sessions to discuss topics of interest and networking activities to grow your system of support. These quarterly meetings will take place regionally allowing attendees the opportunity to broaden their network to include GNJK participants from other counties.
