#### Here are some of the responses:

- Hosting a parents' cafe, which is a more relaxed setting.
- Informational Facebook posts.
- We post displays in the classroom that include pictures of the children involved in process art, graphs showing results of discussions, and charts with answers from the "Question of the Day."
- We have a Parent Committee that meets every month.
- Back to School Night includes time for parents to visit interest centers and explore the materials. This helps them understand how children learn through play.
- Hosting parenting workshops: weekly, in the evening, or with professional speakers
- Newsletters include: health topics, upcoming community events, parenting articles and resources, and positive guidance suggestions
