We want to thank our generous funders and donors who made the following highlights of the past year possible:

- More than 68,000 families were reached. We developed new, online programming to ensure families we served could stay connected to services and be the best parents they could be.

- Our community education reached thousands of parents through our various programs including: an interactive film screening of the Spare the Child documentary (addressing the harm of corporal punishment on our children) and an incredible “Ask A Pediatrician” webinar. Parents raved about the events and have asked for more!
- Impact100 Essex awarded us a grant to serve 5 Essex County schools with our trauma informed work, reaching hundreds of educators, children and families. As a result, they improved their knowledge about Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACES) and learned compassionate, healing ways to recognize and respond to children who experienced trauma.
- ChildWIN® reached more than 6,000 educators and 1,000 children across New Jersey in trauma-informed practices with our research-based, highly effective Trauma Transformation Initiative.

As we look ahead, we need your continued support of our children. We hope you will learn about our mission, our commitment and passion that keep children safe. Your investment in our work will make an impact in the lives of children now and for their future.

Working With **PARENTS**

“Thanks to the program, I learned to recognize at what level my baby’s development is and in which areas she needs more support.”

HFA & PAT Parents:

- **4,739** families served
- **95%** have a primary care provider
- **92%** were screened for intimate partner violence
- **90%** successfully attended their 6-8 week postpartum visit

HFA: Healthy Families America is a national home visiting program that promotes child well-being and prevents abuse and neglect of children through family-focused and empathic support provided in the home.

PAT: Parents as Teachers is a national home visiting program that builds strong communities, thriving families, and children who are healthy, safe and ready to learn.

EPPC Parents:

- **392** parents received EPPC services
- **40%+** were referred for: breastfeeding consultation, WIC, childbirth education, SNAP, clothing/furniture/household items, housing assistance, mental health counseling, support groups, and employment services
- **Participated in a Zoom session:**
“Newark Trust for Education’s Great Start, Great Future Series”
- **Fathers** attended the Milestone Madness event
- **42** attended CAB meetings



Period of PURPLE® Crying Parents:

- **40,000** new parents were educated in their hospital room by a maternity or neonatal nurse
- **6,000** received handmade infant caps to reinforce safety

- **12** parent workshops were held
- **325** parents attended a workshop

PLP Parents:

- **410** parent groups were held for teen parents to learn about child development, parenting, healthy relationships and life skills
- **61** attended the virtual 2021 conference
- **98%** were promoted to the next grade level

PETA Parents:

- **270** were trained on prevention of child abuse and neglect
- **3,150** received evidence-based information on child abuse prevention topics

- › **14,000** children were supported in the counties of: Mercer, Monmouth, Middlesex, Ocean, Somerset, Essex and Hudson

ChildWIN® Youth:

- › **749** children participated in a Peaceful Practices session

PLP Children:

- › **80%** attend PLP childcare
- › **85%** are up to date with immunizations
- › **100%** have a primary care provider

HT Prevention:

- › Nearly **3,500** youth were reached via prevention curricula and assemblies between 2014-2021

Home Visiting in NJ:

- › We completed **78** site visits
- › We provided **33** trainings
- › **445** home visitors and supervisors were supported

Regional Northeast PAT Hub:

- › **20** affiliates were supported in Maryland, Massachusetts, New York, Vermont and Washington, DC
- › **504** technical assistance sessions were provided
- › We provided **42** CoP

EPPC:

- › **62** community agencies participated in 3 CAB meetings

Grow NJ Kids:

- › Coached and supported **198** childcare centers, 46 family childcare providers, 38 school district preschool programs and 10 Head Start preschool programs
- › Provided **1,186** hours of virtual coaching/mentoring/consultation to childcare directors, principals and teachers
- › Facilitated **32** Peer Learning Communities, uniting directors and teaching staff from 7 counties
- › Trained **7,114** early childhood professionals on Developmentally Appropriate Practices

ChildWIN®:

- › Our experts trained **4,787** professionals
- › Our team worked with **7** school districts in 6 counties: Essex, Hudson, Mercer, Middlesex, Monmouth and Somerset

PLP Sites:

- › **100%** of PLP site staff stated they have excellent relationships with PCA-NJ staff
- › **90%** of PLP site staff have taken and are satisfied with PLP Core Trainings led by PCA-NJ staff
- › **100%** of PLP sites have access to self-paced web courses

Connections Matter:

- › **24** professionals were trained to be facilitators, representing 17 NJ organizations
- › The Facilitator network reached **1,220** professionals and community members in 19 counties via 56 trainings
- › **98%** of participants rated the overall quality of Connections Matter training as high or very high
- › **99%** of training participants found it useful for their work with children and families

PETA:

- **2,000** professionals were trained on the prevention of child abuse and neglect
- **1,950** educational materials/activities were distributed to professionals to integrate prevention into their work with parents/caregivers

HT Prevention:

- **1,500** professionals have been reached with DMST training since the start of the program
- Online symposium for Prevention Partners was held on cultivating resilience as a component of prevention, with **95%** of participants feeling more confident in their ability to support youth in building resilience
- Prevention Partners were trained on virtual facilitation of prevention curricula to continue prevention work under social distancing guidelines
- **75** participants received MLMC trainings, representing 21 states and Canada to implement a 10-session prevention program with girls. 100% said they have an increased understanding of their individual roles in identifying victims of exploitation and responding to disclosures.







CM: Connections Matter is a healing-centered curriculum that teaches adults how to use the power of connections to help develop healthy brains and supportive relationships, prevent and heal from ACEs and strengthen communities.

CoP: A Community of Practice is a group of people who share a concern or a passion for something they do and learn how to do it better as they interact regularly.

DMST: Domestic Minor Sex Trafficking

ECS: Early Childhood Specialist

EPPC: Essex Pregnancy and Parenting Connection

FY: Fiscal Year

HFA: Healthy Families America is a national home visiting program that promotes child well-being and prevents abuse and neglect of children through family-focused and empathic support provided in the home.

HV: Home visit, one that is provided by a PE (Parent Educator for PAT) or an FSW (Family Support Worker for HFA). Home visits support pregnant people and parents with young children in achieving positive maternal and child health outcomes.

MLMC: My Life, My Choice empowers vulnerable youth to be agents of change in their own lives and in the movement to end the commercial sexual exploitation of children.

PAT: Parents as Teachers is a national home visiting program that builds strong communities, thriving families, and children who are healthy, safe and ready to learn.

Period of PURPLE® Crying: The normal, yet frustrating period of time from about 2 weeks of age continuing until about 3-4 months of age when an infant's crying is at its peak; a phase in a child's development that will pass.

PETA: The Parent Education Technical Assistance program raises awareness and educates New Jersey parents and professional on prevention of child abuse and neglect.

PLP: Parent Linking Program provides pregnant and parenting adolescents with the support they need to graduate high school and strengthen their parenting skills.

Postpartum: the period of time just after delivery

PRA: Perinatal Risk Assessment

SBS: Shaken Baby Syndrome

SPECT: Single Point of Entry and Client Tracking

TAS: Technical Assistance Specialist
