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Trainings we offer:

Child Abuse and Neglect Prevention: Protecting Children By Supporting Families

This training is designed for people who interact or work with children and families to understand ways to connect families to resources and support in order to reduce family stressors and prevent child maltreatment. This training will discuss racial disparities in the child welfare system in New Jersey and how child wellbeing is a shared responsibility. Training participants will examine their own biases and assumptions about families, and explore how to engage families in as effective helpers. Finally, participants will learn about resources available throughout New Jersey for families.

Duration: 90 minutes

Connections Matter NJ

Connections Matter NJ is a healing-centered curriculum that teaches adults how to use the power of connections to help develop healthy brains and supportive relationships, prevent and heal from Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs), and strengthen communities by building resilience and compassion. This free training is available as a 2-part series to organizations and community groups either virtual or in person.

Duration: 1, 2 or 4 hours

Domestic Minor Sex Trafficking Overview & Prevention

This workshop provides an overview of human trafficking in New Jersey, with a particular emphasis on the commercial sexual exploitation of children. At the end of this workshop, participants will be able to define DMST and the conditions that support it, identify signs and red flags of potential victims, and how to report and implement prevention strategies to protect youth from trafficking.

Duration: 1-2 hours

ACE Interface

The Understanding ACEs: Building Self-Healing Communities presentation is presented in three sections:

1. Neurobiology & Epigenetics focuses on how our brains adapt to our environment during childhood & some basic concepts about related to how toxic stress can impact healthy development
2. Key Findings from the Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACE) study highlights some of the data from the original ACE Study
3. Resilience provides a framework for thinking about resilience, & focuses primarily on attachment & belonging, supporting individual capabilities, & culture, community, & spirituality as key protective systems

Duration: 3 hours

Period of PURPLE Crying®

The goal of the project is to prevent Shaken Baby Syndrome (SBS) injuries and deaths by implementing a program that ensures parents/ caregivers understand the properties of crying that are frustrating, the appropriate responses to take with crying infants and the importance of sharing this information with others. This program teaches prevention strategies for SBS injuries and deaths among infants who are delivered at hospitals across the state.

Enough Abuse

Enough Abuse: Strategies for Your Family and Community is the Campaign's core training curriculum. This training can be adapted to meet the needs of the audience, level of expertise of participants and time.

The curriculum is divided into three major sections:

- Understanding child sexual abuse as a public health problem
- Conditions that support child sexual abuse
- Preventing child sexual abuse

Duration: 2 hours
